Ideas for position:

Here are just a few ideas I have

1. Newly Developed Stock Market Game

- a. I know at the moment we already have a stock market game, but we can take it one step further. The goal of course is to make the most money, but also to develop a strategy.
 - i. Each team would have to write a report explaining the methods they used to accomplish their returns.
 - ii. The struggles they faced with their team, whether they were investing in a bull or bear market, the risk they faced such as permanent capital loss, did you make rational decisions because you were fearful or greedy perhaps, how did you analyze whether the stock would be a good investment, did you look into the beta, P/E ratio, did you use technical analysis, how did you manage multiple risks?
 - iii. That's what you have to figure it as a team, go beyond just saying this is a good company lets invest, but becoming a second level thinker and explaining why.

2. Host guest speaker series, welcome to all

- I've had the opportunity to connect and be in contact with many distinguished professors from Stanford, MIT, Duke, Yale, Northwestern, UCLA, UC Berkeley, UChicago, UPenn Wharton, UMich Ross, Columbia University, and Harvard.
 - I would love to organize monthly guest speaker events with college professors for DECA students
 - These events would consist of lectures from professors talking about popular topics like entrepreneurship, marketing, organizational behavior, investing, venture capital, etc.
 - At the end students would get the opportunity to ask the professors questions about anything, from life at the university, to the majors offered at the business school, to the topics they addressed in their lecture, etc.
 - Allowing students to get a sneak peek as to what top universities offer at the college level.

3. Launch a student led digital business magazine

- Allow DECA students to write about topics ranging from marketing to finance for high school students
 - Write articles that are relatable to teens right now
 - Basic personal finance skills, write about students who invest already, and have a savings account
 - Kids who have jobs, interview them about what they do with that money
 - Let students learn basic writing skills, and to work on their interviewing skills
 - Write about popular topics among DECA students such as entrepreneurship, find student entrepreneurs and ask them as to how they started their businesses
 - And then explain the basics of entrepreneurship, ranging from what is a business plan, to what consist of a business plan, and truly what makes a good entrepreneur
